A Harvey man pleaded guilty to manslaughter Friday in the hammer bludgeoning death of **Christian Smith**, 20, of **Gretna**.

Shawn Carter, 23, was sentenced to 40 years in prison, the maximum sentence for manslaughter. He had originally been charged with first-degree murder and armed robbery. But there were no witnesses to the killing and the state accepted his plea, entered before 24th Judicial District Judge Melvin Zeno. **Carter** said he and **Smith** had gotten into an argument and that he struck him in the head with a hammer. Manslaughter is a homicide committed in the heat of passion.

Smith's nude body was found on his bedroom floor in his home in the 2100 block of Hancock Street by neighbors June 1, **1994**. The hammer was buried almost two inches in his skull.

Gretna police said that after the killing, Carter had taken Smith's cellular telephone and automobile.
